Teacher's Notes: Before, During, and After Watching the Video

Before Watching the Video

- **Introduce the Topic:** Begin by asking students about their favorite seasons and why they like them. Discuss typical weather in their area during different seasons.
- **Activate Vocabulary:** Pre-teach key terms from the video such as "humid," "air conditioning," "clear sky," "fresh," "windy," and "snow."
- **Set the Context:** Explain that the video is a conversation about seasons and weather in Japan. Highlight cultural differences in weather experiences between countries.
- **Set a Purpose for Watching:** Tell students they will answer questions about the video, focusing on how Takashi describes the seasons in Japan.

During Watching the Video

- **First Viewing:** Play the video without interruptions. Ask students to listen carefully and get a general understanding of Takashi's favorite season and how he describes the weather in Japan.
- **Second Viewing:** Play the video again, pausing after each season is described. Encourage students to take notes, particularly focusing on specific weather descriptions and Takashi's preferences.
- **Engagement Activity:** Ask students to raise their hands when they hear familiar words or phrases related to seasons and weather.



After Watching the Video

- **Quiz Activity:** Have students complete the quiz above, either individually or in pairs. Review the answers as a class and discuss any questions they found challenging.
- **Discussion:** Compare and contrast the weather in Japan with the weather in your local area. Encourage students to discuss which season they would enjoy most in Japan and why.
- **Follow-Up Task:** Ask students to write a short paragraph about their favorite season and describe the weather in their country during that season. Encourage them to use vocabulary from the video.
- **Extension Activity:** Show a map of Japan and discuss how climate varies by region, focusing on the northern parts that experience heavy snow in winter.
